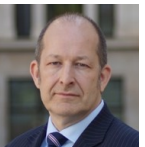

Simon Whitehouse CSyP CPP PSP FSyI MIET RISC MI-APSC is a Chartered Security Professional (CSyP), an ASIS International qualified Certified Protection Professional (CPP) and Physical Security Professional (PSP). He is current chair of The Security Institute Middle East Members Group (MEMG) as well as a Fellow of the Security Institute. His current professional memberships include ASIS International, The Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET), The Association of Security Consultants (ASC) and the International Association of Professional Security Consultants (IAPSC). Simon's career in security started in 1985, as a security surveyor with Honeywell, before progressing to senior management positions with security systems integrators. In 2003, Simon became an independent security consultant, forming SGW, which has grown from grass roots as a home-based business, to a now internationally acclaimed and highly respected international consulting practice. In 2010, Simon expanded from his UK origins to establish a strong footprint in the GCC region of the Middle East and is now a Security Industry Regulatory Agency (SIRA) licensed Security Consultant, ('formally Dubai Police, Department of Protective Systems'). Simon is also listed in the Red Book as a SABRE Registered Assessor and SABRE Registered Professional in the area of 'Security Strategy', 'Security Design & Engineering' and 'Operational Security'. Simon's SABRE licence number is SLC-004-001, and he is licenced by BRE to display the SABRE Badge of Recognition accordingly. During his 35 year career, Simon has led consulting teams in the delivery and management of iconic CCTV and Security projects in many varied vertical market sectors across the world.

Andrew Donaldson is Head of Special Projects at Pool Re. He currently embedded with Counter Terrorism Policing on matters to enhance the country's resilience to terrorist attacks. He joined Pool Re after a distinguished career with the police, during which he spent most of his service in counter-terrorism. Andrew then supported the Foreign and Commonwealth Office with capacity building overseas, notably in India after the Mumbai attacks, before an attachment to the Association of Chief Police Officers (Terrorism and Allied Matters) supporting the Extremism Task Force in 2013, including liaison duties in Europe. He subsequently undertook several roles with the Ministry of Defence, including official duties in the United States of America, during a time which saw the rise of Daesh and persistent terrorist threats throughout mainland Europe.

David McKelvey retired from The Metropolitan Police Service as a Detective Chief Inspector in 2008 where he became one of the most effective detectives in dismantling organised crime networks. He formed TM-Eye, the parent company to MLB, to investigate the supply of counterfeit goods and undertake private criminal prosecutions. TM-Eye is now the most effective and respected private organisation in this field and has teams focusing globally on luxury goods, tobacco, pharmaceuticals and design rights along with high value frauds. This is supported by covert experts and a new office being established in India. To date over 400 private prosecutions have been undertaken with a 100% conviction rate. David saw TM-Eye as the "catch" and "convict" arm of the organisation and had the vision to form MLB as the front end to 'prevent' and 'deter' crime and anti social behaviour. David continually advises high-profile clients and organisations from the worlds of commerce and media on matters of corporate and private security / investigation.

Chris Mossop is a Detective Chief Inspector with Greater Manchester Police. An experienced officer with 19 years police service he has mostly been engaged with the Serious Crime Division. As a Senior Investigating Officer he has led proactive investigation of drugs, robbery, kidnap and firearms crime. He currently works within Programme Challenger within the GMP Organised Crime Coordination Unit and Modern Slavery Team.

Bill Butler LLB, CPFA, CSyP was Chief Executive of the Security Industry Authority from 2009 until his retirement in May 2015. He has spoken on regulation and the security industry in the UK and internationally and has extensive regulatory, audit and finance expertise, having previously been a director at the Gambling, Healthcare and Audit Commissions. He is a Chartered Public Finance Accountant and was proud to be admitted as a Chartered Security Professional in 2014. He is the Chair of the Audit Committee at the Gangmasters Licensing Authority and a member of the Regulatory Panel of the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy. In retirement, he plans to spend more time on his hobbies, in amateur theatre and sailing.

Sir David Veness, CBE, QPM, former Under-Secretary-General for Safety and Security, Department of Safety and Security, United Nations. David served as the first Under-Secretary-General of the UN Department of Safety and Security from its creation in 2005 until June 2009. This role carries responsibility for UN operations globally. Prior to this appointment, he was Assistant Commissioner (Specialist Operations) New Scotland Yard from 1994-2005. He joined the Metropolitan Police as a cadet in 1964 and as a constable in 1966. In the course of his police career he specialised in crisis management, serious crime investigations, hostage negotiations and counter-terrorism. He is presently an Honorary Professor of Terrorism Studies at the Handa Centre for the Study of Terrorism and Political Violence at the University of St. Andrews (Fife, Scotland) and Co-Chair of the Consultative Board of the UK National Cross Sector Security & Communications project (CSSC) which seeks to enhance overall public protection by greater public/private sector co-operation. This project was initiated prior to the London Olympics & Paralympics in 2012 and proved to be a success which has been sustained and enhanced since to optimise benefit for public security. In addition, he undertakes international strategic advisory tasks in counter-terrorism capacity and capability building, especially in developing nations. David was educated at Trinity College, Cambridge (MA, LL.M) and attended the Royal College of Defence Studies in 1990. He was awarded the Queens Police Medal in 1994, appointed as a Commander of the British Empire (CBE) in 2000 and was Knighted in 2004.

Dr Craig McCann is an accomplished leader who, following service in the Metropolitan Police Service, is now the Owner/Director of Spectrum Universal Ltd. He is an internationally recognised specialist in building the capacity of international security sector partners to prevent individuals from being drawn into terrorism. He has a PhD in comparative politics exploring how the U.K. CT Prevent Strategy is applied to right wing extremism, which is now published as a book for the Routledge Extremism and Democracy range.

Chris Greany is an accomplished speaker and 'thought leader'. He is responsible for delivering across Templar's international cyber practice, particularly the build out and development of Templar Ireland, GCHQ Certified Training and linked operational engagement across EMEAA. He is a member of the Cyber Security Advisory Board for the Institute of Asset Management and founding partner of the Global Cyber Alliance. He has served with Barclay's Bank and as a member of the Bank of England's Cyber Security Board. He is co-author of a new book 'Managing Cyber Security Risk 3', Reuvid Books (2019). Chris completed a long and distinguished police career with the Metropolitan and City of London Police forces spanning counter terrorism, intelligence and serious crime. His final policing role was as Commander within the National Police Chiefs' Council. He delivered the build out of the UK's national fraud and cyber-crime protection centre - emulated internationally. He is an independent trustee of Police Care UK and an Ambassador for Riding for the Disabled (RDA).

Justin Crump is CEO of Sibylline Ltd, a global intelligence and risk analysis consultancy. His areas of significant interest include international jihadist terrorism, aviation and maritime security, social media, extremist activism and cyber issues. He is a contributing blogger to the Huffington post and a regular broadcast media guest commentator on security and intelligence affairs, particularly on al-Jazeera. Justin has a BA in politics from Durham and an MA in War in the Modern World from King's College London. Seventeen years' regular and reserve service in the British Armed Forces included operational experience in the Balkans, Iraq and Afghanistan, and a tour as the personal staff officer to the Duke of Westminster. A former investment banker and management consultant, before founding Sibylline he spent three years as a Director of Threat Intelligence for another major risk firm. He is an active participant in the not-for-profit City Security and Resilience Networks (CSARN), editing their bi-monthly UK and Ireland Risk Monitor.

Matthew Hone QPM is a serving Police Sergeant with the City of London Police. With 19 years of policing experience, Matthew has worked in the area of counter terrorism since 2008. In the 2018 New Year's Honours List Matthew was awarded the Queens Police Medal (QPM) for his leadership in relation to counter terrorism policing.
